In Denmark, an art therapy programme is offered as a three-year adult education programme. It is regarded as a kind of psychotherapy education programme. Applicants must have completed a three-year professional education within the fields social worker, nurse, pedagogue, ergo therapist, teacher, priest, doctor etc. and have minimum two years of relevant work experience.

As far as I can see, the language of instruction is Danish.

In the UK in order to work as an Arts Therapist you have to complete a Postgraduate Diploma approved by the British Association of Arts Therapists (BAAT)- <http://www.baat.org> When you have qualified you need to register with the Health Professions Council (HPC) - <http://www.hpc-uk.org> Both of these organisations can provide information on approved courses which are offered by several UK universities. Courses take 2 years full time and 3 years part time.

People who work as Arts therapists in Sweden usually have a University degree in Psychotherapy. After that they have taken courses in Art therapy or other forms of expressive therapy, like dance- or music therapy. These courses are not part of the formal education system. In Hungary arts therapy is offered for teachers, psychologists, doctors and graduates in arts as a post graduate evening course at the University of Pécs, Arts and Medical School: <http://www.aok.pte.hu/>, <http://art.pte.hu/>

This is a 5-semester course, 6 times two days/semester, Fridays and Saturdays. Students are required to pay tuition fee and can specialize in music therapy, fine arts therapy and dance and movement therapy.
